Fiction Allende DAUGHTER OF FORTUNE

The story of a young woman's quest for love and fortune during the California Gold Rush.

Fiction Chiaverini THE SUGAR CAMP QUILT *(Elm Creek Quilt Series)*

In Creek's Crossing, Pennsylvania, in the years before the Civil War, Dorothea Granger agrees to sew an unusual quilt to fulfill her uncle's deathbed request, realizing later that the quilt pattern contains an Underground Railroad map.

Fiction Dallas TRUE SISTERS

1856. Mormon converts Nannie, Louisa, Jessie, and Anne travel in the Martin Handcart Company, making the 1,300-mile journey on foot from Iowa City to Salt Lake City, while enduring unimaginable hardships.

Fiction Doig THE WHISTLING SEASON

Hired as a housekeeper to work on a Montana homestead in the early 1900's, Rose and her brother endeavor to educate a widower's sons while witnessing local efforts on a massive irrigation project.

Fiction Ferber SO BIG

The heartfelt story of a woman's life and her struggle to raise her only son during the late 1800s and early 1900s in rural and urban Chicago.

Fiction Harrison ONE THOUSAND WHITE WOMEN

The courageous daughter of western homesteaders finds herself bound to her crippled father and learns to live within the constraints of that responsibility.

Fiction Lahiri THE NAMESAKE

A portrait of immigrant experience follows the Ganguli family from traditional life in India through their arrival in Massachusetts. In the late 1960s and their difficult melding into an American way of life.

Fiction Turner SARAH'S QUILT

Arizona Territory pioneer Sarah Prine struggles with drought, starving cattle and a neighbor's unwelcome advances.

Fiction Tyler DIGGING TO AMERICA

A chance encounter between two families--the Donaldsons, and the Iranian-born Yasdans--at the Baltimore airport, as both couples await the arrival of an adopted daughter from Korea, prompts an examination about what it means to be an American while the lives of the two families intertwine over the years.

- Return bookmarks to the Information Desk or submit online before the library closes on November 30 for entries into the drawing (one entry for every five hours of reading).

Book Reviews

- Write a short review of a book, audiobook or article you have read Sep-Nov on the sheet provided. More sheets are available at the Information desk or online.
- Return completed reviews to the Information Desk or submit online before the library closes on November 30 for entries into the drawing (one entry per review).

Community Read

- Read Willa Cather's *My Antonia* sometime during Sep-Nov.
- Return completed community read sheet to the Information Desk before the library closes on November 30 for ten entries into the drawing.

Reading Bingo

- Read books Sep-Nov fitting the descriptions in five boxes in a row (vertical, horizontal, diagonal) on the bingo sheet provided and mark off the boxes as you finish them. More sheets are available upon request.
