#### Fiction Kondazian THE WHIP

An authentic Western inspired by the true story of a woman, Charlotte "Charley" Parkhurst (1812-1879) who lived most of her extraordinary life as a man in the old West.

#### Mystery Box

##### OPEN SEASON (Joe Pickett series)

As Wyoming game warden Joe Pickett races against time to save an endangered species, he finds himself involved in a deadly mystery that threatens his family and the life he loves.

##### THE COLD DISH (Longmire series)

A young man once convicted for raping a Cheyenne girl is found dead, prompting sheriff Walt Longmire, his deputy Victoria Moretti, and friend Henry Standing Bear to investigate.

##### TRACK OF THE CAT (Anna Pigeon series)

Fleeing New York to find refuge as a ranger in the remote backcountry of West Texas, Anna Pigeon stumbles into a web of violence and murder when a one park ranger is mysteriously killed and another ranger vanishes.

#### Fiction Russell DOC

After the burned body of a mixed-blood boy is discovered in 1878 Dodge City, Kansas, part-time policeman Wyatt Earp enlists the help of his professional-gambler friend Doc Holliday.

#### Fiction Harrison ONE THOUSAND WHITE WOMEN

A portrait of the American West follows May Dodd as she leaves the East Coast asylum to which she had been committed by her high-society family, heads west and, with the help of a government program, ends up marrying a chief of the Cheyenne nation.

#### Fiction Jiles NEWS OF THE WORLD

In the aftermath of the Civil War, Captain Jefferson Kyle Kidd, an elderly widower and itinerant news reader, is offered fifty dollars to bring an orphan girl, who was kidnapped and raised by Kiowa raiders, from Wichita Falls back to her family in San Antonio.

#### Mystery Andrews TENSLEEP (Em Hansen series)

Em Hansen, the only woman on an isolated oil rig and an outsider to little Meeteetse, Wyoming, attempts to discover the cause of two suspicious deaths, becoming a primary target for a ruthless killer.

#### Mystery Hillerman SPIDER WOMAN'S DAUGHTER (Leaphorn & Chee series)

A daughter takes on her famous father's legacy in resuming a series focused on Navajo culture. Bernadette Manuelito is at the helm of a mystery involving all Shiprock's Navajo Tribal Police force when one of her longtime colleagues is gunned down after a breakfast with co-workers.

## BOOK REVIEWS

- Write a short review of a book, audiobook or article you have read June-August on the sheet provided. More sheets are available at the Information desk or online.
- Return completed reviews to the Information Desk or submit online before the library closes on August 31 for entries into the drawing (one entry per review).



## SCAVENGER HUNTS

- Complete a scavenger hunt June-August. Additional scavenger hunts are available at the Information Desk or online.
- Return completed scavenger hunts to the Information Desk before the library closes on August 31 for entries into the drawing (one entry per hunt).
