## 2016 YEAR IN REVIEW



### HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Celebrated 100-year anniversary on April 18th with a carnival, displays from the last 100 year presentations and a formal program featuring the presentation of a centennial song and a message from Governor Gary Herbert
- ◆ The library participated in Logan City's Sesquicentennial
- ◆ S.A.G.E. (Senior Adults Gaining Enrichment) University program was created to provide informative events for seniors.
- ◆ Launched 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program
- ◆ Talks about a new library continued with discussions about location, building size, architects, tours of other libraries
- ◆ Library Community Fair and Maker Faire on April 16th (attendance 700)
- ◆ Logan Library Comic Con on June 4th (attendance 1003)
- ◆ Participated in the Cache Valley Storytelling Festival and the Story Swap monthly meeting
- ◆ The building's air conditioning was out of commission for two months during the hottest part of the summer
- ◆ USU Homecoming Parade on September 24th participation
- ◆ Cultural celebration on July 16th: Portable Identities – Celebrating Cultural Diversity at the Logan Library
- ◆ New 3-D printer for public use donated by the Friends of the Logan Library
- ◆ Celebrated Hispanic Heritage Month with a festival on September 17th (attendance 600), children's crafts on September 29th, a movie on October 4th, Gallery Walk and Nacho Night for teens on October 7th
- ◆ 'Book A Librarian' program started in September
- ◆ The library attained the status of 'Large Library Group' for libraries serving a community of 50,000 or more residents
- ◆ 3rd annual Children's Halloween Carnival (attendance 1350) and the 2nd annual Teen Humans vs Zombies events in October
- ◆ Library Holiday Film Festival from December 22 - 30 (open days) with an overall attendance of 145

# CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

April 18, 2016 marked the 100th birthday of the Logan Library. The celebrations started in April of 2015 with a pre-centennial party on the 18th of each month featuring the news and happenings of each decade. A centennial logo and flag were created to commemorate the year. A centennial song, *100 Years of Words*, was composed by library staff member Robert Linton, with lyrics by Lyndi Perry.

On Monday, April 18, 2016, the library held a special Centennial Celebration (122 attendees). The activities included a library carnival (600), the presentation of a time capsule, a special video message from Governor Herbert, a musical performance of the centennial song by Cache Valley Children's Choir, light refreshments and short speeches by local leaders.

The entire year and the final event were a demonstration of what the Logan Library has achieved in the last 100 years and an example of what we hope to achieve in the next 100 years!

# PROGRAMS

The library provided many fun and informative programs in 2016. The Community Fair and Maker Faire (700 attendees), Comic Con (1003), and the Hispanic Heritage Festival (600) were all very successful. The Children's Halloween Carnival (1350) and the Teen's Humans vs Zombies (150) events in October were overwhelmingly attended and enjoyable for all. The library remains committed to providing quality program for all ages.

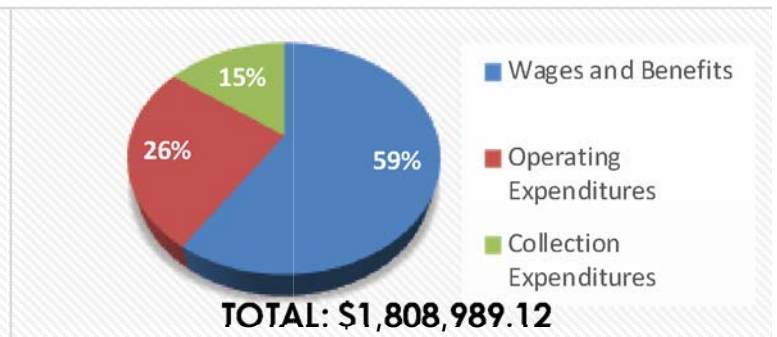
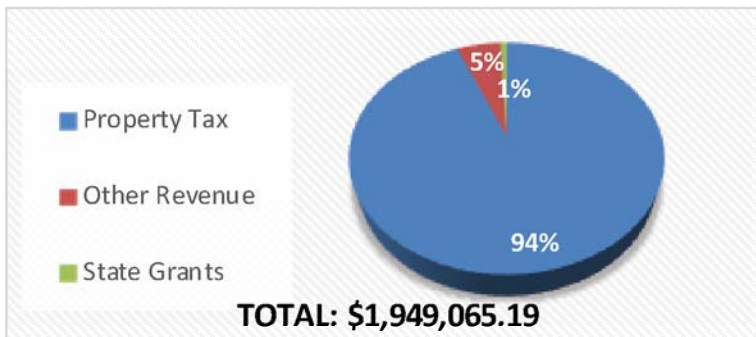
The City of Logan fiscal year runs July through June. These figures are for July 2015 to June 2016.
