More Information

- **2012 Economic Report to the Governor** - Annual report to the governor on Utah's economic outlook. Includes information for the entire state and individual counties on demographics, employment and wages, income, business, cost of living, education and more.
- **Cache County Auditor** - The Auditors office provides core financial services for the county government by tracking budget expenditures, revenues, fixed assets, grants, payroll processes, issuing receipts and reporting the same for all departments and funds of the county.
- **Internal Revenue Service Tax Statistics** - Tax statistics on a nationwide level on topics including business taxes, individual taxes, charitable organizations and more.
- **Utah Property Tax Annual Statistical Reports** - State and county level statistics on property taxes assessed and collected.
- **Utah State Tax Commission Annual Report** - The Utah State Tax Commission is required to publish an annual report giving information about the State Tax Commission and economic and statistical information about the State of Utah.
- **Utah State Tax Commission Economic and Statistical Unit** - Statistics on taxes in Utah including tax burdens, sales taxes, tourism taxes, and income and corporation taxes.
