

LOGAN LIBRARY

2014 YEAR IN REVIEW



HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ The **Latino Advisory Council** was formed in February to help the library promote services and build relations in the Latino community.
- ◆ The Children's Division began offering a **Spanish language Story time** in addition to their regular and toddler story times.
- ◆ The Children's Division also started the **After School Programs** in September.
- ◆ In April, the library decided to participate in the **Downtown Gallery Walk** which is a community C.V.C.A. event held several times every year. The library stayed open until 9:00 pm on each Friday evening.
- ◆ The **Friends of the Logan Library** started the **'Lunch 'n Learn' program** and presented quarterly meeting which included several guest speakers. There were 228 patrons who attended these programs.
- ◆ The Friends of the Library held a **huge book sale** from the donation of over 30,000 books from Books of Yesterday book store (closed). This book sale was held in an off site building and generated over \$15,000. Books left over from the sale were purchased by the Utah charity Worldwide Book Drive.
- ◆ A **Community Fair** was held during National Library Week in April and was well attended.
- ◆ The library celebrated the **Hispanic Heritage Month** starting in September with children's crafts, salsa dancing, piñata decorating, Hispanic art and music at the October Gallery Walk, and a dress-up El Chavo party.
- ◆ The library held a **Halloween Carnival** in October with carnival games, balloon animals, treats and fun. There were about 400 kids and adults who participated.
- ◆ A **Digital Media Lab** was set up and opened for patrons who wish to come and get creative.
- ◆ The Logan Library achieved the status of **'Quality Library'** in a certification process from the Utah State Library. The status indicates that the library provides a level of service that exceeds the standards set by the state library.
- ◆ In addition to the regular **Teen Tuesday programs**, the Young Adult division had several special events for teens. Karlie Major, 2014 Miss Utah, gave a presentation about promoting positive body image.
- ◆ Logan City received a grant to build a **bike shelter** on the south side of the library.

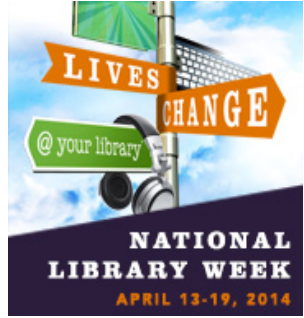

MANY SUCCESSFUL EVENTS

The library initiated several events this year that are sure to become annual events.

The **Community Fair** was held during National Library week and was well attended. We wanted to highlight a variety of services and organizations that a lot of patrons are unaware of and that benefit the community. The Fair was a great success. There were many people that came for the information, fun and games. We will definitely be doing this event next year.



The Children's Division started **Spanish Story Times**, the **After School programs** and held a very successful **Halloween Carnival**.

- There were 30 Spanish Story times held during the year with a total attendance of 1,055.
- The After School programs started in September and featured presenters from USU's Natural History Museum, Cache Makers, and our Latino Advisory Council.
- For the Halloween Carnival, about 400 kids and adults came dressed in their costumes to play carnival games, get treats and have fun.

PROGRAMS

The library provided many fun and informative programs in 2014. The Community Fair, Downton Abbey event, the Hispanic Heritage Month activities, Learning @ the Library (64 classes with 169 attendees) were all very successful. The children's programs, in addition to story times and the Summer Reading program, were enthusiastically attended.

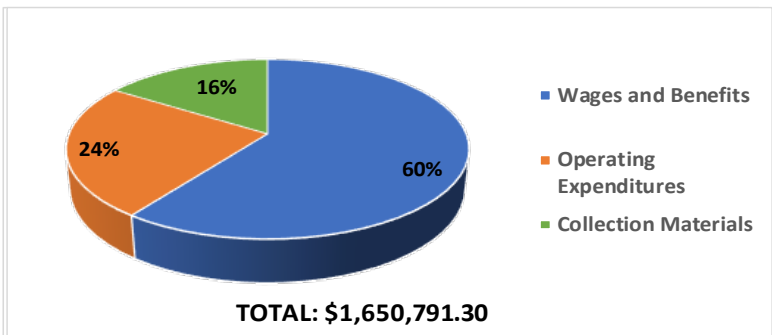
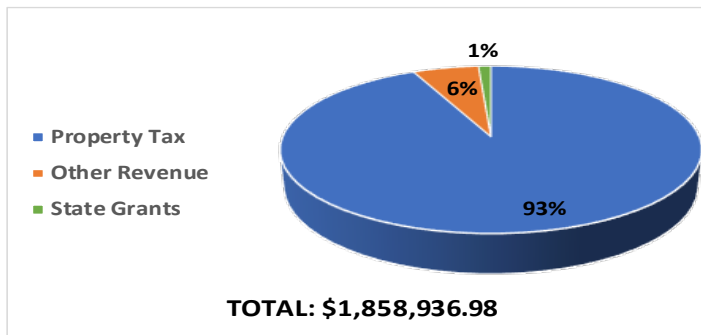
The City of Logan fiscal year runs July through June. These figures are for July 2013 to June 2014.
