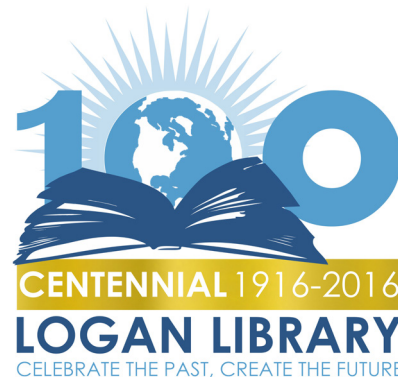


LOGAN LIBRARY

2015 YEAR IN REVIEW



HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ April 18, 2015, the library's 99th birthday, marked the start of the **Library Centennial Celebration**. The 'kick-off' event was held featuring a short ceremony, light refreshments and the debut of the library's centennial song composed by Robert Linton.
- ◆ The library celebrated the year leading up to its **100th birthday** with monthly presentations and activities covering all the decades the library has been open.
- ◆ In conjunction with our Centennial Celebration, the library gathered and preserved **oral histories** of library remembrances.
- ◆ The **'Book Selfie'** project was started, asking patrons to submit to the library a photo of themselves holding a book where they appear to be part of the cover.
- ◆ The **2nd Annual Community Fair** was held in April to celebrate 'unlimited possibilities' at our library. It was held outside on the plaza and included an Earth Day celebration.
- ◆ Library Director Robert Shupe participated in the selecting of **Star Coulbrooke as Poet Laureate** for Logan City and the library is a co-sponsor for all of the poet's public appearances.
- ◆ The **'Dia de los Niños, Dia de los Libros - Children's Day, Book Day'** was celebrated on April 25th with crafts, games, activities and a puppet show.
- ◆ The **Friends of the Library Book Store** held its grand opening in April. Located just inside the west entrance of the library
- ◆ September brought the celebration of **Hispanic Heritage Month** with several library-hosted events, including a festival on September 26th with entertainment and food vendors on the plaza.
- ◆ The library partnered with the **Cache Valley Storytelling Festival**, co-sponsoring several events and holding the Story Swap in the library.
- ◆ The library joined **Twitter, YouTube, and Pinterest**, in addition to its existing Facebook page.
- ◆ A **'Human vs. Zombies'** event, in partnership with Logan High School and North Logan City Library, was held in October.
- ◆ **Senior Thursdays** started in August and were held on the second Thursday of each month. They included a variety of presentations and activities especially for senior adults.
- ◆ The **'Book A Librarian'** service started in September, offering free, one-on-one customized help and skill-building sessions with a librarian or subject specialist. "Learn *what you want, when you want.*"
- ◆ The **'Kindles for Check-Out'** service offered library card holders the opportunity to check out a Kindle eReader pre-loaded with eBooks.

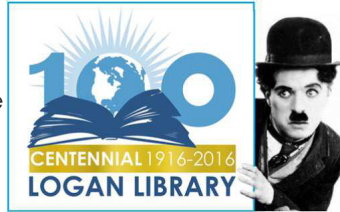

100TH BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

On or near the 18th of each month during the year leading up to the 100th birthday in 2016, the library celebrated one of the decades it has been open.



- **April 18th** was the kick-off event with a short ceremony and presentations.
- **May 18th** we remembered the 1910s with a Charlie Chaplin film, displays on the significant events, with free Oreo cookies which were invented then.
- **June 18th** we hosted a 'Roaring 20s' event with the movie 'The Great Gatsby,' a speakeasy club with mocktails and Charleston dance lessons.
- **July 18th** we celebrated the 1930s with children's melodramas, the movie 'The Wizard of Oz' and free 1930s theater candy.
- **August 18th** was a presentation on life and the library in the 1940s, with newsreels and cartoons, books, toys, candy and games from the era, and the showing of 'Casablanca.'
- **September 18th** we got hip with the 1950s, played cool games and stirred up some malt shoppe memories with a soda fountain.
- **October 19th** had displays showing the social, cultural, and historic elements that were the 1960s. We also had games, candy and a showing of the movie 'The Jungle Book.'
- **November 18th** was a Star Wars celebration with cantina karaoke, crafts and a showing of 'Star Wars: A New Hope.'
- **December 18th** we celebrated the 1980s 'to the max' with a film festival of movies from the decade and retro Nintendo gaming.

PROGRAMS

The library provided many fun and informative programs in 2015. The monthly centennial celebrations (600 attendees), Community Fair (877), Downton Abbey event (68), Comic Con Fandom(33), Hispanic Heritage Month (758), Children's Halloween Carnival (450), and Gallery Walks (296) were all very successful.

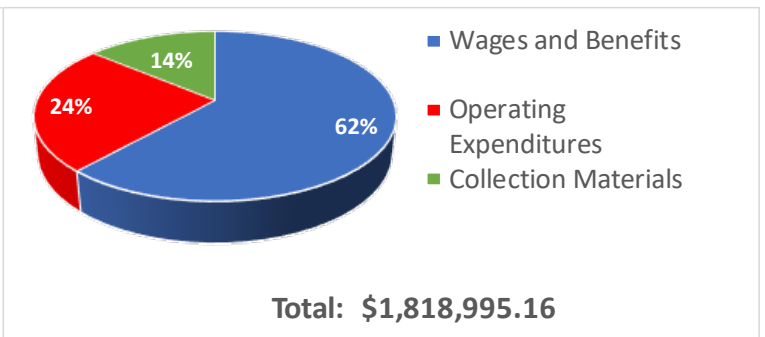
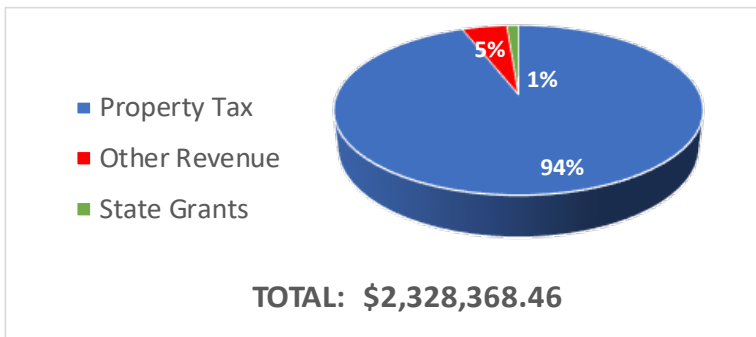
The City of Logan fiscal year runs July through June. These figures are for July 2014 to June 2015.
