EVENTS:

- **July 2018** – Crafters’ Conference with panel discussions, demonstrations, and projects.
- **August 2018** – Booth at the Cache County Fair. Special Mention for best use of theme.
- **September 2018** – The annual Hispanic Heritage Festival was held with over 500 in attendance. Patrons enjoyed food, dancing, booths and lots of fun. This event is held outside on the plaza.
- **October 2018** – Halloween Carnival. Over 600 ghouls (patrons) trick or treated and participated in activities.
- **December 2018** – Celebrating National Hour of Code with a grant from American Library Association. Teens spent time learning about coding.
- **January 2019** – Family Game Night. January was a successful Harry Potter themed evening. Held on the 2nd Friday of each month, we have board games, bingo and an escape room.
- **January 2019** – 3rd Annual Writers’ Conference featuring several Utah writers. Patrons learned how to edit, research, get an agent and publish their own works.
- **January 2019** – Tyler Whitesides and Frank Cole, local authors, presented a fun filled afternoon of potions and drumming. We had over 250 patrons in attendance.
- **April 2019** – National Library Week was celebrated with our annual Community Fair. We invited over 40 organizations to participate and had over 600 patrons in attendance.

GRANTS WE RECEIVED:

- **June 2018** – Community Library Enhancement Fund (CLEF) grant from the Utah State Library. We purchased new laptops, bookclub Kindles and children's computers.
- **June 2018** – Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) grant from the Utah State Library. We purchased gaming laptops and robotic devices for our teens and tweens. We also purchased more children's computers.
- **June 2019** – CLEF grant from the Utah State Library. We purchased more laptops.
- **June 2019** – LSTA Technology Grant from the Utah State Library. We received \$5000 towards the replacement of our disc cleaning machine.

NEW AT THE LIBRARY

2018-2019 brought the introduction of several new and unusual services.

July 2018: A telescope was donated to the library from the Cache Astronomy Club. The telescope can be checked out to patrons. It is so successful that the library asked for a second telescope.

July 2018: Pick-it-Up - patrons with available hold can now wait in their car while a staff member brings their items to them.

July 2018: New databases purchased! Creativebug and Niche Academy.

November 2018: The Spiral Jetty Backpack was donated to us from the Utah Museum of Fine Arts. This interactive backpack allows our patrons to fully explore the Spiral Jetty.

January 2019: Family Game Night became a monthly activity on the 2nd Friday of each month. We have board games, bingo and an escape room.

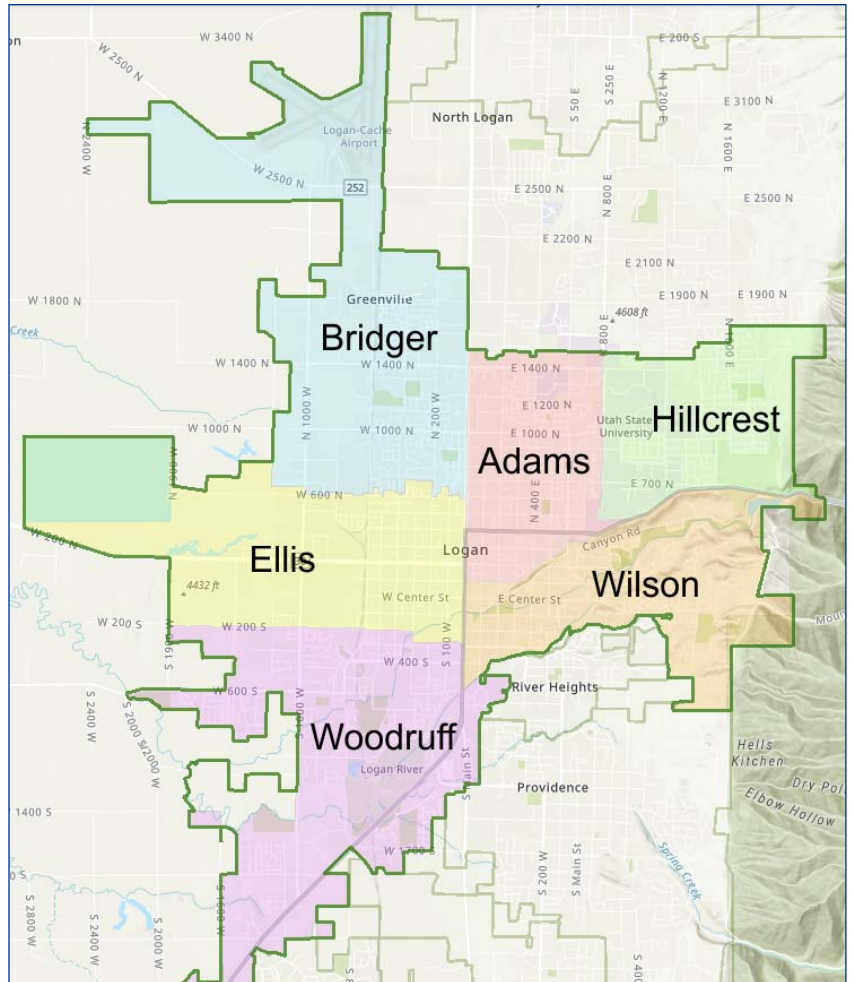

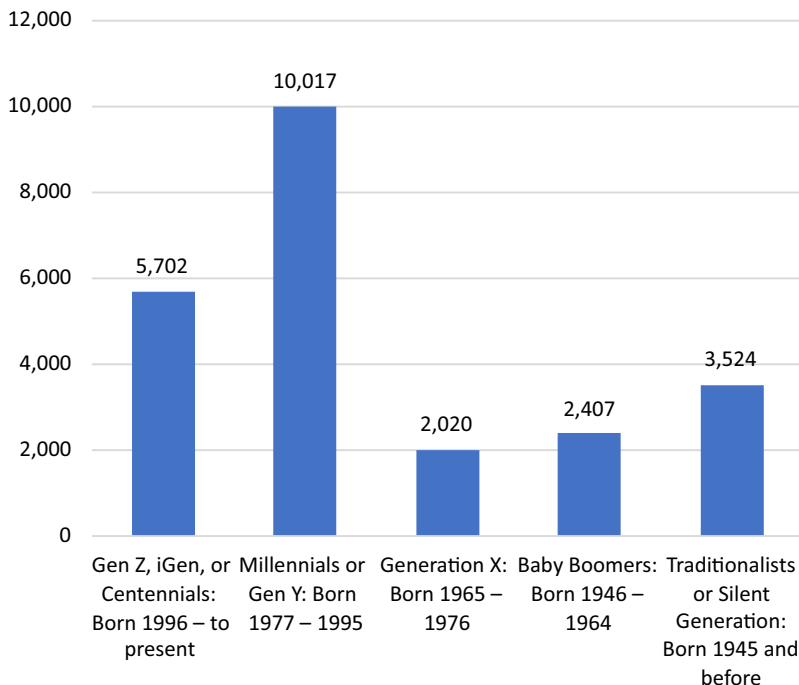

CITY OF LOGAN NEIGHBORHOOD TRENDS

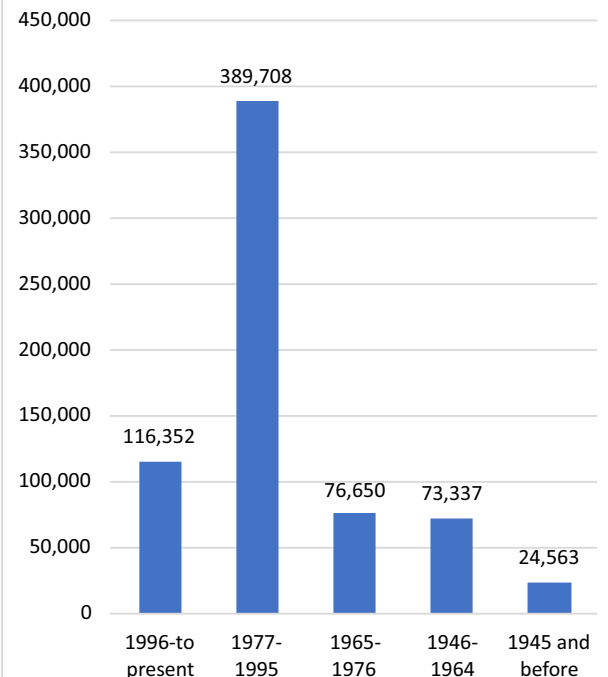

CHECKOUTS BY AGE GROUP

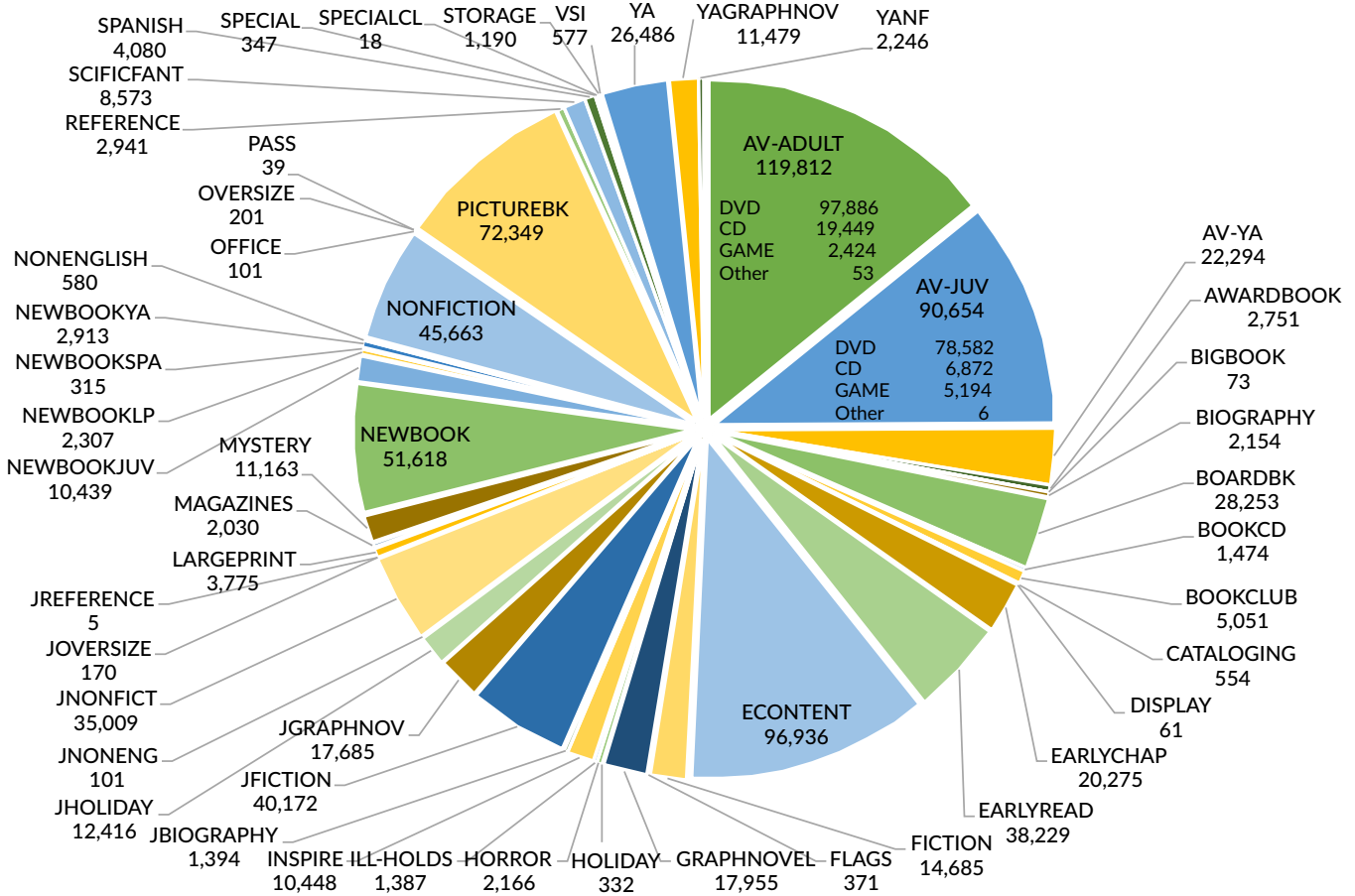

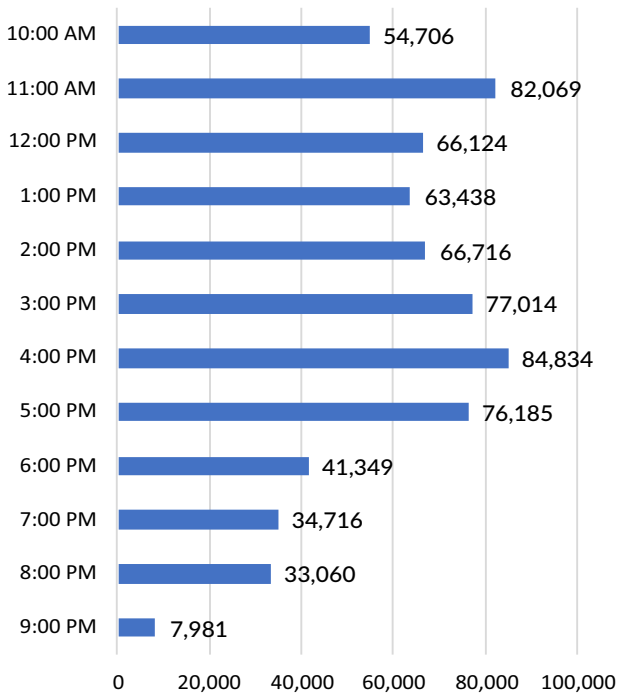

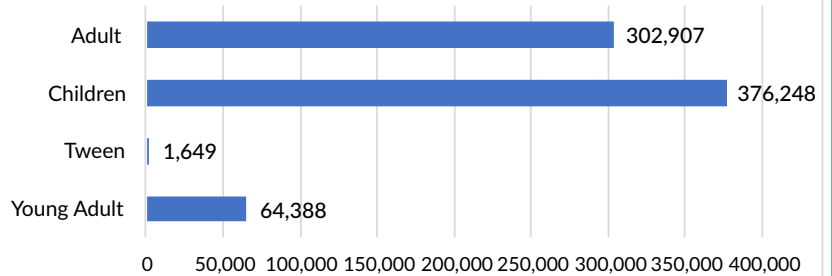
CHECKOUTS BY LIBRARY LOCATION
