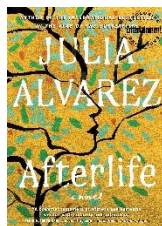
Mexican gothic

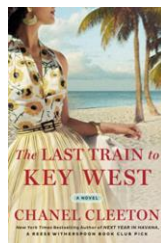
Book of unknown Americans

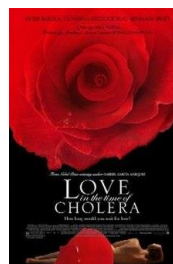
Afterlife

In 1935 three women are forever changed when one of the most powerful hurricanes in history barrels toward the Florida Keys.



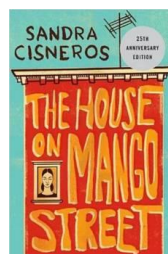
Love in a time of cholera

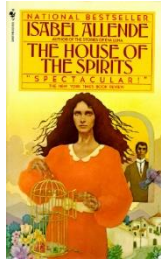
Hummingbird's daughter

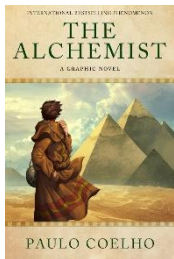
