

O R D I N A N C E .

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE STORING, SALE, DISCHARGE OF FIRING OF FIRE WORKS OR OTHER PYRO TECHNIC DISPLAY, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE SAME AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, CACHE COUNTY, UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The discharge, firing or use of all fire crackers, rockets, torpedoes, Roman candles, or other fire works or substances designed for or intended for pyro technic display, and all pistols, canes, cannons or other appliances using blank cartridges or caps containing chlorate or potash mixtures, or other explosives, are hereby prohibited within the corporate limits of the City of Logan.

SECTION 2. The sale of any fire crackers, rockets, torpedoes, Roman candles, or other fire works or substances designed and intended for pyro technic display, and all pistols, canes, cannons or other appliances using blank cartridges or caps containing chlorate or potash mixtures, or other explosives, are hereby prohibited within the corporate limits of Logan City.

SECTION 3. The storage of any fire crackers, rockets, torpedoes, Roman candles, or other fire works or substances, designed and intended for pyro technic display and all pistols, canes, cannons or other appliances using blank cartridges, or caps containing chlorate or potash mixtures or other explosives, are hereby prohibited within the corporate limits of Logan City.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50.00 or by imprisonment in the city jail, for a period of not more than 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. A public necessity existing therefore it is hereby declared that this ordinance shall be effective upon its approval and publication as required by law.

O R D I N A N C E .

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON OR PERSONS TO PARADE UPON OR BE UPON ANY STREET OR PUBLIC PLACE IN LOGAN CITY, WHILE WEARING ANY MASK OR DISGUISE, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, or associations of persons to parade, appear, congregate, be or remain on any street or public place of Logan City, Utah, while said person, persons, or association of persons are wearing any mask, disguise or devise whatsoever which shall be intended to or shall have the effect of preventing the entire face and features of said person, persons, or association of persons from being at all times plainly visible to the public.

SECTION 11. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$300.00, or by imprisonment for not to exceed six months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION III. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION IV. It is hereby found that a public necessity exists, and it is hereby declared that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after publication as required by law.

Be it enacted by the Mayor and City Commissioners of Logan City as follows:-
 First that Section 310 of the Revised Ordinance of Logan City 1912 be and it is hereby amended to read as follows, to-wit:

Provided further that where additions are made or installed whereby additional water will be taken or used for a less period than six months, the use of such water must be paid for at the pro-rate annual rate, in advance at the time of inspection as herein provided.

SECTION 2. ^{Payment} Be it further enacted that ~~all~~ ^{the} customers ~~paying~~ ^{paying} for their water on a meter rate, who shall pay for the same on or before ~~fifteen~~ ^{thirty} days next succeeding the ~~month~~ ^{month} of which said bill is incurred shall receive a discount of 10 per cent of the amount of said bill, and all customers paying for their water on a flat rate shall received 10 per cent discount from the amount of the bill, providing that the same shall be paid within sixty days from the time that said sum shall become payable, provided also that no balance paid after the dates above specified shall be entitled to receive a discount.

SECTION 3. ~~Provided that~~ ^{the} City ~~can~~ ^{may} install meters at any place being served by Water Works Department for the protection of the City. When private residences request meters same to be installed at their expense ~~or on such terms as the city commissioners may determine.~~

SECTION 4. Under no consideration ~~will~~ ^{shall} the said City Water Works Department be responsible for damages done by water caused by frozen pipes or faulty valves or shut off cocks caused by constant use by plumbers or property owners. Every tap or connection made to the said City Watermains must put in or provide a shut off or stop and waste valve for the protection of their own property.

SECTION 5. An emergency existing therefore is hereby ordered that this ordinance shall take effect upon publication, as provided by law.

SECTION 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION L OF AN ORDINANCE OF LOGAN CITY ENTERED: "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SUBDIVISIONS "C" AND "D" OF SECTION L OF AN ORDINANCE OF LOGAN CITY ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AUTOMOBILE GARAGES, CLOTHES CLEANING ESTABLISHMENTS, THE USE, HANDLING, AND STORAGE, AND SALE OF INFLAMABLE LIQUIDS AND THE PRODUCTS THEREOF, PASSED ON THE 25th DAY OF MARCH, 1919 and SECTION 2 OF SAID LAST MENTIONED ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDERED, by the City Commissioners of Logan, Utah, as follows:-

Section 1. That Subdivioidn "C" of Section of an Ordinance of Logan City entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AUTOMOBILE GARAGE, CLOTHES CLEANING ESTABLISHMENTS, THE USE, HANDLING, AND STORAGE, AND SALE OF INFLAMABLE LIQUIDS AND THE PRODUCTS THEREOF," and passed on the 25th day of March, 1919, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"C" A PUBLIC GARAGE is a building or place where automobiles are repaired, kept or stored by any person, firm or corporation for another or by the public or for
