

ORDINANCE.

UNLAWFUL TO ALLOW DOGS TO RUN AT LARGE DURING CERTAIN HOURS OF THE NIGHT TIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS AT LOGAN CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Unlawful to allow dogs to roam at large, etc.

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, own or possess any dog over the age of six months and allow the same to roam at large within the corporate limits of Logan City between the hours of sunset in the evening and sunrise in the morning. The Chief of Police, or any owner of sheep or cattle, finding such dogs roaming at large and upon or near their premises, where such sheep or cattle are confined, are hereby authorized to kill or cause to be killed all such dogs so roaming at large between the hours of sunset in the evening and sunrise in the morning.

Section 2. Penalty. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.00, or more than \$50.00

Section 3. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby Ordered that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.

O R D I N A N C E .

UNLAWFUL TO SELL MERCHANDISE, ETC., IN POOL ROOMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Unlawful to Sell, Merchandise, etc, in Pool Rooms, It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, store, sell, or offer to sell, goods, wares or merchandise, other than tobacco, cigars, soft drinks, candy and chewing gum, in any pool hall, billiard hall, or bowling alley in Logan City.

Section 2. Buildings to be Enclosed, etc. All rooms or buildings in which goods, wares or merchandise, other than tobacco, cigars, soft drinks, candy and chewing gum, are kept, sold, or offered for sale in this City, shall be enclosed and separated from any pool hall, billiard hall, or bowling alley by substantial solid partitions extending from the floor to the ceiling. It shall be unlawful to have any door, window or other opening in the partition wall between any pool hall, billiard hall or bowling alley in this City, and any other room or place where any goods, wares, or merchandise, other than tobacco, cigars, soft drinks, candy and chewing gum, are kept, stored, sold, or offered for sale.

Any violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed a misdemeanor.

Section 3. Penalty. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine in any sum not to exceed \$299.00, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding Ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

CLOSING ORDINANCE.

UNLAWFUL FOR RESTAURANTS, ROOT BEER STANDS, ETC, TO REMAIN OPEN AFTER ONE O'CLOCK A. M.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Restaurants, Soft Drink Stands, etc., to Close at One o'clock A. M. It shall be unlawful for any owner, manager, leasee, clerk or employee of any restaurant, hot dog stand, root beer or Soft Drink Stand, Candy Kitchen, Soda Water Fountain, or any other eating or drinking place within the Corporate Limits of Logan City, to remain open after the hour of one o'clock A. M. and before the hour of five o'clock A. M. of the same day, and it shall be the duty of every person, managing any such eating and drinking place to cause the same to remain closed between the hours of one o'clock A. M. and five o'clock A. M.

Section 2. Penalty. Every person conducting any such eating and drinking place of business in Logan City, in violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be liable to a fine in any sum less than \$50.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby Ordered that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.

ORDINANCE .

An Ordinance making additional appropriations for the support of the City government for the year 1928.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah:

Section 1. That the following sums of money or as much thereof as may be necessary be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any money in the City Treasurer not otherwise appropriated for the support of the various departments indicated for the calendar year ending December 31, 1928. Said appropriations are further itemized in the requests on file for such appropriations and are in addition to those heretofore made by Ordinance passed by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah, December 23, 1927, to-wit:

ORDINANCE

UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE ROLLER SKATING RINK ON SUNDAY, OR AFTER MIDNIGHT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY.

UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Unlawful to Operate Roller Skating Rink on Sunday. It shall be unlawful for any person, agent, owner, or employee, or lessee, to conduct, operate or maintain within the corporate limits of Logan City, any public roller skating rink in any public hall or enclosure upon any Sunday, where an admission fee is charged.

Section 2. Unlawful to Operate Roller Skating Rink After Midnight. It shall be unlawful for any person, agent, owner or employee to conduct, operate or maintain any public roller skating rink where an admission fee is charged between the hours of 12:00 o'clock, Midnight, of any day and 6:00 o'clock A.M. of the following day.

Section 3. Penalty. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not more than \$299.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not more than three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby Ordered, that the Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.
