

ORDINANCE .

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PART OF SECTION 147, AND SECTION 958 of THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, 1927.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sections Amended. That part of section 147 of the Revised Ordinances of Logan City, Utah, 1927, be amended by amending the definition of an Apartment House to read as follows:

"APARTMENT HOUSE. An apartment House is a building containing separate apartments for four or more families, living independently, or a building containing 4,000 or more square feet of floor space."

In all other respects Section 147 as now enacted remains in full force and effect. Section 958. That section 958 be amended to read as follows:-

"958. Fees. The fees to be collected by the Inspector shall be as follows:

- For issuing permit and inspection of mainline outlet. .50
- For outlets at which current is controlled or used. .05
- For arc lamps or light outlets requiring 400 Watts or more, for the first outlet .50
- For each additional outlet .25
- For projecting or flat signs 1.00

For the purpose of this ordinance electric signs shall be declared to be signs constructed as follows: Signs, all or any part of the letters of which are made in an outline of incandescent lamps; signs with painted flush raised or transparent letters, lighted by electric lamp or lamps attached thereto; signs having a border of incandescent lamps attached thereto, and reflecting light thereon; signs having electric lamp and reflecting light thereon, and transparent glass signs lighted by electricity.

For each motor irrespective of horsepower 1.00

Controlling devices for motors and generators are included in the above price.

For an electrical elevator there shall be charged a fee of \$2.00 for the special control wiring plus the regular charge per horsepower for motor as provided in this section.

All special circuits for heating devices or electrical apparatus included above that require 600 Watts or more shall be charged for at the rate of 50¢ per circuit.

For any electrical wiring, fixtures, apparatus or appliance or installation for which no fee is herein provided a charge of \$1.50 for the first hour or part thereof and at the rate of 75¢ per hour for all additional time given in making such inspection.

Section 2. Emergency. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby ordered that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 429-A, OF REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, 1927, AS AMENDED ON THE 20th DAY OF MARCH, 1931.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section Amended. That section 429-A of Revised Ordinances of Logan City, 1927, as amended on the 20th day of March, 1931, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

429-A. Transient Merchants Defined. License - Any person, or agent, servant or employee of any person, who shall exhibit, sell or offer for sale at retail, any goods, wares or merchandise in or from any hotel, rooming house, dwelling house, boarding house, store, store room, stall, tent, building, structure, stand or other place in Logan City, and who shall not occupy said place for the purpose of conducting a permanent business therein, shall be deemed a transient merchant for the purpose of this section.

It shall be unlawful for any person, or for any agent, servant, or employee or any person, to engage in business in Logan City, as a transient merchant without first obtaining a license so to do. A license for transient merchants shall be as follows:

- \$25.00 for the first day;
- \$20.00 per day for the next three days;
- \$15.00 per day for the next ten days;
- \$10.00 per day for the next thirty days; and
- \$ 8.00 per day thereafter, provided that yearly license for transient merchant shall be \$200.00 per annum.

Section 2. Emergency. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby ordered that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.

ORDINANCE .

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 192, OF REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, 1927.

BE IT ANACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sections Amended. That Section 192 Revised Ordinances of Logan City, 1927, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

192. Duties, Additional Compensation. The City Attorney shall have charge of all legal matters pertaining to the rights, obligation, property, property rights, administration, officers and agents; he shall also have charge, in the City's behalf, of all litigation to which the City is a party. For extra services, or important litigation conducted on the City's behalf, he shall receive such additional compensation as may be provided in such cases by the Board of City Commissioners. Should he have personal knowledge of any violation of a City Ordinance, or receive reliable information of any such violation, he shall immediately institute the necessary steps to bring the offender to punishment.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby ordered that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.
