

ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE TRANSMISSION LINES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LOGAN, CACHE COUNTY, UTAH.

Section 1. That there is hereby granted to Utah Power & Light Company, its successors and assigns (herein called the Grantee), the right, privilege, or franchise, until July 1, 1968, to construct, maintain, and operate electric light and power lines, together with all the necessary or desirable appurtenances (including underground conduits, poles, wires, transmission lines, and telegraph and telephone lines for its own use), in, over, along, upon and across all the present and future streets, alleys and public places in Logan City, Utah, where intersected by the following described course:

Beginning on east limits of City at a point 330 feet south and 660 feet west, more or less, from the northeast corner of the northwest quarters of Section 36, T. 12 N., R. 1 E., S.L.B.& M., thence running westerly and southwesterly over private land to Canyon road, thence along the north side of Canyon road to a point opposite Third East street produced north, thence southerly across private land to the intersection of Third East street and Center street, thence south along the west side of Third East street to the north side of Third South street, thence along the north side of Third South street to the Providence-Millville road, thence along the west side of the Providence-Millville road to the south limits of City at south bank of Logan River.

Also beginning on east limits of City at a point 125 feet south and 660 feet west, more or less, from the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of Section 36, T. 12 N., R. 1 E., S.L.B.& M., thence running northwesterly, over private land to the south line of Section 25, Township and Range aforesaid, thence over private land west along the south line and north along the west line of said Section 25 to road, thence north along the east line of said road to north limits of City at the east and west center line of said Section 25.

Also beginning on south limits of City at south line of Section 4, T. 11 N., R. 1 E., A.L.B.& M., thence running north along the east side of Sugar Factory-Wellsville road to Sixth South street, thence along the north side of Sixth South street to the Logan-Mendon Highway, thence along the north side of said Highway to west limits of City at the north and south center line of Section 5, Township and Range aforesaid.

Also beginning at power line on north side of Canyon road at a point 1550 feet south and 2700 feet west, more or less, from the northeast corner of Section 35, T. 12 N., R. 1 E., S.L.B.& M., thence running southeasterly across said road and over private land to south limits of City at south bank of Logan River.

And beginning at power line on north side of Canyon Road at a point 1750 feet south and 3470 feet west, more or less, from the northeast corner of Section 35, T. 12 N., R. 1 E., S.L.B. & M., thence running across said road and southeasterly and southwesterly over private land to south limits of City at south bank of Logan River.

for the purpose of transmitting electrical power or energy over said lines to persons and corporations beyond the limits of said Logan City for light, heat, power and other purposes.

Section 2. The Grantee shall not acquire any rights hereunder to furnish electric energy to said City or its inhabitants.

Section 3. Poles shall be so erected to interfere as little as possible with traffic over said streets and alleys. The location of all poles, and conduits shall be fixed under the supervision of said Board of Commissioners, but not so as unreasonably to interfere with the proper operation of said lines.

Section 4. The location of said lines within the City limits be hereby confirmed and approved.

Section 5. All lines constructed under this grant shall be constructed in accordance with established practices with respect to electrical construction.

Section 6. The City shall in no way be liable or responsible for any accident or damage that may occur in the construction, operation, or maintenance by the Grantee of its lines and appurtenances hereunder, and the acceptance of this franchise shall be deemed an agreement on the part of said Grantee, its successors and assigns, to indemnify said City and hold it harmless against any and all liability, loss, cost, damage, or expense which may occur to said City by reason of the neglect, default, or misconduct of the Grantee in the construction, operation, or maintenance of its lines and appurtenances hereunder.

Section 7. The Grantee shall file its written acceptance of this franchise with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners within this thirty (30) days after its passage.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect as soon as it shall be published as required by law, deposited and recorded in the office of the Recorder, and accepted as required herein.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PEACEFUL PICKETING WITHIN LOGAN CITY.

Numerous complaints having been made to the City Officers, Mayor and City Commissioners of Logan City that person, persons, association or combination of persons carrying on peaceful picketing in Logan City do so by patrolling back and forth immediately in front of the building or place of business, and in such close proximity to the place of business as to unduly interfere with the business being picketed and its patrons, and in such a manner as to intercept, persuade, or urge other persons and patrons from patronizing said business which is being picketed. NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, or combination of persons, picketing within the corporate limits of Logan City, to patrol or picket within 15 feet of the place of business being picketed.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons picketing within the corporate limits of Logan City to intercept, persuade, or otherwise urge any other person from patronizing any duly regularly licensed business within 15 feet of the said place of business.

Section 3. Emergency. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist and it is hereby ordered that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 31 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, 1927, BY ADDING SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 481a.

WHEREAS, numerous complaints have been made to the City Commissioners and officers of Logan City concerning individuals claiming the right to solicit at private homes without a license,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF LOGAN CITY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section Added. That section to be known as 481a be added to Chapter 31 of the Revised Ordinances of Logan City of 1927 as follows:

481a. SOLICITING From House to House Without Licence - Nuisance.

Soliciting from house to house, without a license, by knocking at the door and/or entering private premises for the purpose of sale, or for procuring orders for the sale of goods, wares, or merchandise, or for the sale of enlarged photographs and/or picture frames, is hereby declared to be a nuisance business.

It shall be unlawful for any person, whether principle or agent, to carry on a nuisance business as herein defined within the corporate limits of Logan City.

Section 2. Penalty. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not less than \$15.00 and not exceeding \$50.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. Emergency. An emergency is hereby deemed to exist, and it is hereby ordered that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its publication.

Section 1.
