

ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance making additional appropriations for the support of the City government for the year 1940 and also making appropriations for the support of the government for the year 1941.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah.

Section 1. That the following sums of money or as much thereof as may be necessary be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any money in the City Treasurer not otherwise appropriated for the support of the various departments indicated for the calendar year ending December 31st 1940, said appropriations are further itemized in the requests on file for such appropriations and are in addition to those heretofore made by ordinance passed by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah December 29th, 1939, to wit:

ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 870 REVISED STATUTES OF LOGAN CITY 1927 RELATING TO PARKING OF AUTOMOBILES ON THE STREETS OF LOGAN CITY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah as follows:

That Section 870 of the Revised Ordinances of Logan City 1927, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

870. HOW LONG MAY STAND. It shall be unlawful, excepting on Sundays and Legal Holidays, for any person to park or leave parked an automobile on any street in the congested district of Logan City for a period longer than two hours between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M., and it shall be unlawful on any day to park or leave parked an automobile on any street in such congested district between the hours of 1:30 A.M. and 7:00 A.M.

An emergency is hereby declared and this ordinance shall take effect upon its publication.

ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF BICYCLES IN LOGAN CITY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF LOGAN CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 1. Definition of the term Bicycle. - - Every device propelled by human power upon which any person may ride, having two tandem wheels either of which is over twenty (20) inches in diameter.

(a) The parent of any child and the guardian of any ward shall not authorize, or knowingly permit, any such child or ward to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance.

(b) These regulations applicable to bicycles shall apply whenever a bicycle is operated upon any street or sidewalk in Logan City, subject to those exceptions stated herein.

Sec. 2. License Required. - - No person, who resides within this City, shall ride or propel a bicycle on any street or sidewalk within this City unless such bicycle has been licensed and the license plate is attached thereto as provided herein.

Sec. 3. License Application. - - Application for bicycle license and license plate shall be made upon a form provided by the City and shall be made to the Chief of Police. An annual license fee of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) shall be paid to the City before each license or renewal thereof is granted.

Sec. 4. Issuance of License. - - (a) The Chief of Police upon receiving proper application therefor is authorized to issue a bicycle license which shall be effective until the next succeeding first day of January.

(b) The Chief of Police shall not issue a license for any bicycle when he knows or has reasonable ground to believe that the applicant is not the owner of or entitled to the possession of such bicycle.

(c) The Chief of Police shall keep a record of the number of each license, the date issued, the name and address of the person to whom issued and the number on the frame of the bicycle for which issued and a record of all bicycle license fees collected by him.

Sec. 5. Attachment of License Plate. - - (a) The Chief of Police, upon issuing a bicycle license, shall also issue a license plate bearing the license number assigned to the bicycle, the name of the City and the calendar year for which issued, and the expiration date thereof.

(b) The Chief of Police shall cause such license plate to be firmly attached to the rear mudguard or frame of the bicycle for which issued in such position as to be plainly visible from the rear.

(c) No person shall remove a license plate from a bicycle during the period of which issued except upon a transfer of ownership or in the event the bicycle is dismantled and no longer operated upon any street in the City.

Sec. 6. Inspection of Bicycles. - - The Chief of Police may inspect each bicycle before licensing the same and may refuse a license for any bicycle which he determines is in unsafe mechanic condition.

Sec. 7. Renewal of License. - - Upon the expiration of any bicycle license the same may be renewed upon application and payment of the same fee as upon an original application.

Sec. 8. Transfer of Ownership. - - Upon the sale or other transfer of a licensed bicycle the license shall remove the license plate and shall either surrender the same to the chief of police or may upon proper application but without payment of additional fee have said plate assigned to another bicycle owned by the applicant.

Sec. 9. Rental Agencies. - - A rental agency shall not rent or offer any bicycle for rent unless the bicycle is licensed and a license plate is attached thereto as provided herein and such bicycle is equipped with the lamps and other equipment required in this article.

Sec. 10. Bicycle Dealers. - - Every person engaged in the business of buying or selling new or second hand bicycles shall make a monthly report to the Chief of Police of every bicycle purchased or sold by such dealer, giving the name and address of the person from whom purchased or to whom sold, a description of such bicycle by name or make, the frame number thereof and the number of the license plate, if any, found thereon.

Sec. 11. Traffic Laws Apply To Persons Riding Bicycles. - - Every person riding a bicycle upon a roadway shall be subject to the provisions of the traffic ordinances of this City applicable to the driver of a vehicle except as to special regulations in this Article and except as to those provisions of the ordinances which by their nature can have no application.

Sec. 12. Obedience to Traffic Control Devices. - - (a) Any person operating a bicycle shall obey the instructions of official traffic signals, signs and other control devices applicable to vehicles, unless otherwise directed by a police officer.

(b) Whenever authorized signs are erected indicating that no right or left or "U" turn is permitted, no person operating a bicycle shall disobey the direction of any such sign, except where such person dismounts from the bicycle to make any such turn, in which event such person shall then obey the regulations applicable to pedestrians.

Sec. 13. Riding on Bicycle. - - A person operating a bicycle shall not ride other than upon or astride the permanent and regular seat attached thereto, nor carry any other person upon such bicycle other than upon a firmly attached and regular seat thereon, nor shall any person ride upon a bicycle other than as such above authorized.

Sec. 14. Speed. - - No person shall operate a bicycle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing.

Sec. 15. Riding on Right. - - Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway shall ride as near to the right hand side of the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction.

Sec. 16. Emerging from alley or drive way. - - The operator of a bicycle emerging from an alley, driveway or building, shall upon approaching a sidewalk or the sidewalk area extending across any alley way, yield the right of way to all pedestrians approaching on said sidewalk or sidewalk area, and upon entering the roadway shall yield the right of way to all vehicles approaching on said roadway.

Sec. 17. Clinging to Vehicles. - - No person riding upon any bicycle shall attach the same or himself to any street car or vehicle upon a roadway.

Sec. 18. Riding in a group. - - Persons operating bicycles upon a roadway shall not ride more than two abreast.

Sec. 19. Carrying Articles. - - No person operating a bicycle shall carry any packages, bundle or article which prevents the rider from keeping at least one hand on the handle bar.

Sec. 20. Parking. - - No person shall park a bicycle upon a street other than upon the roadway against the curb or upon the sidewalk in a rack to support the bicycle in such manner as to afford the least obstruction to pedestrian traffic.

Sec. 21. Riding on Sidewalks. - - Bicycles must ride on the street on Main street from Second South to Third North Streets on both sides of the street, on Center and First North Streets on both sides of the street, on Center and First North Streets from Main to First West and First East Streets, and on Federal Avenue from Main to Church Avenue.

(b) The Chief of Police is authorized to erect signs on any sidewalk or roadway prohibiting the riding of bicycles thereon by any person, and when such signs are in place no person shall disobey the same.

(c) Whenever any person is riding a bicycle upon a sidewalk, such person shall yield the right of way to any pedestrian.

Sec. 22. Lamps and reflectors on Bicycles. - - Every bicycle when in use at night time shall be equipped with a lamp on the front which shall emit a white light visible from a distance of at least five hundred feet to the front, and with a red reflector on the rear which shall be visible from all distances from fifty feet to three hundred feet to the rear when directly in front of lawful upper beams of headlamps on a motor vehicle. A lamp to the rear may be used in addition to the red reflector.

Sec. 23. Brakes on Bicycles. - - Every bicycle shall be equipped with a brake which will enable the operator to make the braked wheel skid on a dry, level, clean pavement.

Sec. 24. Penalties. - - Every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars or by imprisonment for not more than twenty-five days, or by removal and detention of the license plate from such person's bicycle for a period not to exceed twenty-five days, or by impounding of such person's bicycle for a period not to exceed twenty-five days, or by any combination thereof.

Sec. 25. Sections Repealed. - - Sections 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 903 and 904 of the Revised Ordinances of Logan City, Utah, 1927, are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 569 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, 1927, REFERRING TO "CLOSING HOURS."

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Cache County, Utah, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 569 Revised Ordinances of Logan City, 1927, prescribing closing hours be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

569. CLOSING HOURS - All places of business and amusement, including billard and pool halls shall close at twelve o'clock p.m. and remain closed until six o'clock a.m. of the next succeeding day, except hotels, lodging-houses, garages, restaurants and drug stores for purpose only of dispensing medicine.
