

ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance making additional appropriations for the support of the City government for the year 1941, and also making appropriations for the support of the City government for the year 1942.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah,

Section 1. That the following sums of money or as much thereof as may be necessary be and the same are hereby appropriated out of any money in the City Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the support of the various departments indicated for the calendar year ending December 31st, 1941, said appropriations are further itemized in the requests itemized on file for such appropriations and are in addition to those heretofore made by ordinance passed by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah, Dec. 27th, 1940, to wit:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 569 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH, 1927, REFERRING TO "CLOSING HOURS."

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Cache County, Utah, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 569 Revised Ordinances of Logan City, 1927, prescribing closing hours be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

569. CLOSING HOURS - All places of business and amusement, including billard and pool halls shall close at twelve o'clock p.m. and remain closed until six o'clock a.m. of the next succeeding day, except hotels, lodging-houses, garages, restaurants and drug stores for purpose only of dispensing medicine.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION-II OF AN ORDINANCE OF LOGAN CITY, CACHE COUNTY, UTAH PROVIDING FOR CLOSING HOURS FOR PLACES OF BUSINESS SELLING BEER AND REPEALING CLOSING ORDINANCE ADOPTED AUGUST 17, 1928.

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Logan City, Utah, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Section 11 entitled "RESTRICTION" under the ordinance of Logan City adopted the 7th day of May, 1937, entitled "An Ordinance of Logan City Providing for the Licensing of The Sale of Light Beer at Retail in Bottles and on Draft, Fixing the Fees Therefore and Regulating the Same." be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 11. RESTRICTIONS:

No person shall sell beer at any public dance or to any person intoxicated, or under the influence of an intoxicating beverage. No license shall be granted to sell beer in any dance hall, theater, or in the proximity of any church or school. No person shall sell beer to any person under the age of twenty-one years, and it shall be unlawful to sell beer on any week day between the hours 12 o'clock midnight and 6 o'clock A.M. or between 12 o'clock Saturday night and 6 o'clock Monday morning, and all places of business of whatever nature or character having a license to sell beer shall be closed for all business between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight and 6 o'clock A.M. of any day. It shall be unlawful to advertise the sale of light beer except under such regulation as is made by the Liquor Control Commission of Utah; provided, that a simple designation of the fact that beer is sold under the City license, may be placed in or upon the window or front of the licensed premises.

No licensee shall violate the terms of the license issued, nor unless he shall be so licensed shall he sell bottled or draft beer for consumption on the premises, or permit any beer to be consumed on the premises.

SECTION 2. That that certain ordinance adopted by Logan City on the 17th day of August, 1928 entitled "Closing Ordinance, Unlawful for Restaurants, Root Beer Stands, Etc., To Remain Open After One O'Clock A.M." be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 429 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF LOGAN CITY, FIXING AMOUNT OF RETAILERS LICENSE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of City Commissioners of Logan City, as follows:

Sec. I -- That Section 429 of the Revised Ordinances of Logan City be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

429. MERCHANTS, RETAILERS, ETC. Amount of License.

Every persons, firm or corporation, directly or indirectly dealing in any manner in motor vehicles, oils, gasoline, coal, lumber, machinery, equipment, appliances of every kind, and nature, hardware, confections, cafes, lunches, ice, milk, food, bakery products, groceries, meats, dry goods, clothing, sport goods, notions, drugs, theatres, or any other kind of goods, wares, or merchandise of any kind of description, for each place of business operated, shall pay the sum of \$75.00 per quarter; provided, however, that if anyone liable for the tax imposed under this section shall furnish the City Recorder, on or before the thirtieth day of the quarter in which the fee is due, satisfactory evidence showing the gross amount of cash receipts collected from sales (excepting sales to the Federal Government, and its agencies, sales in interstate commerce, and wholesales sales of automobiles and products manufactured in Logan City) by such licensee during the preceding quarter, then and in that case only, the City Recorder shall collect as the tax imposed by this section, seventy-five cents (75¢) on each One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00). or fraction thereof, of such gross cash receipts from sales not exceeding such maximum fee, but not less than \$3.00 per quarter.

Sec. II -- Every wholesaler maintaining an agency or warehouse for distribution of gasoline and lubricating oil; groceries and produce at wholesale within Logan City shall pay an annual license fee in the sum of Fifty Dollars. (\$50.00).

Sec. III -- Police to act as inspectors of licenses: All police officers are hereby appointed inspectors of licenses, and in addition to their several duties as police officers, are hereby required to examine all places of business and persons in their respective beats liable to pay a license, and to see that such licenses are taken out, and shall have and exercise the power:

- 1st. To make arrests for the violation of any of the provisions of this chapter:
- 2nd. To enter free of charge, at any time, any place of business for which a license is required by this chapter and to demand the exhibition of such license for the current time by any person engaged or employed in the transaction of such business and if such person shall then and there fail to exhibit such license, such person shall be liable to the penalty provided for violation of this chapter.

It is hereby made the duty of the police officers to cause complaint to be filed against all persons violating any of the provisions of this chapter.

The Chief of Police is hereby directed to carry into effect the provisions of this chapter:

Sec. IV -- All ordinances or parts of ordinances now in force contrary to the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
