ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND REGULATING USE OF PUBLIC STREETS IN THE CITY OF LOGAN; DEFINING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PARKING METER ZONES; REGULATING AND CONTROLLING AND PROVIDING FOR INSPECTION OF THE PARKING OF VEHICLES THEREIN BY THE USE OF PARKING METERS; PRESCRIBING LIMITS OF TIME FOR PARKING IN PARKING METER ZONES; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LOGAN, STATE OF UTAH:

SECTION 1. Definitions.

(a) For the purpose of this ordinance the words "Parking Meter Zones," shall mean portions of streets described and established by the City Commissioners as Zones within which the parking of vehicles shall be controlled, regulated, and inspected with the aid of timing devices or meters, hereinafter referred to as parking meters or meters.

(b) The definition of any term used in this ordinance not otherwise herein defined shall be the same as such, as defined and described in the Vehicle Code of the State of Utah and amendments thereto, and ordinances of the City of Logan.

SECTION 2. PARKING METER ZONES ESTABLISHED. The following portions of streets in the City of Logan are hereby established as Parking Meter Zones;

Main Street: From First South to Third North

Center Street: From Main Street to First West and from Main Street to one-half block east.

First North Street: From Main Street to First West Street and from Main Street to one-block east.

SECTION 3. CHIEF OF POLICE SHALL DESIGNATE PLACES FOR PARKING METERS AND RESERVE SPACES. The Chief of Police shall with the approval of the City Commissioners install parking meters in the Parking Meter Zones hereafter and hereby established by the City Commissioners, for the purpose of, and in such numbers and in such numbers and in such places as in his judgement may be necessary for the regulation, control, and inspection of the parking of vehicles therein.

The Chief of Police with the approval of the City Commissioners is further authorized and directed to reserve in said zone spaces for loading or unloading, passenger loading or unloading, bus stops, taxicab stands, transfer stands and other spaces for the use and convenience of the public.

SECTION 4. MAXIMUM PARKING LIMIT. The Chief of Police with the approval of the City Commissioners, is authorized to determine the maximum parking time to be allowed in various parts of such Parking Meter Zones, and to cause signs which will fulfill the requirements of the ordinances and resolutions of the City pertaining thereto, to be placed in the various parts of such zones to so designate.

SECTION 5. MARKING OF METER AREAS AND PARKING THEREIN. The Chief of Police shall have lines or marks painted upon the curb or street next to each parking meter, designating the parking for which said meter is to be used, and each vehicle parked next to any parking meter shall park within said lines of markings. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any such line or marking, and to park a vehicle in such a position that it shall not be entirely within the space designated by such lines or markings, except where otherwise provided by ordinance.

SECTION 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause, allow, permit or suffer any vehicle registered in his name or operated or controlled by him to be or remain in any space upon any street within a parking meter zone adjacent to which a parking meter is established for more than one hundred twenty (120) consecutive minutes or any time during which the meter is displaying a signal indicating that that space is illegally in use, except during the time necessary to set the said meter to show legal parking and excepting also, during the time from 6:00 P. M. to 9:00 A. M. and during legal holidays, and Sundays.

SECTION 7. METERS CHARGES. When any vehicle shall be parked in any space along side of or next to which a parking meter is located in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance the operator of said vehicle upon so parking shall, and it shall be unlawful to fail to, deposit immediately one or more, one cent or five cent coins of the United States in such parking meter and then turn the operating key of said meter in a clockwise direction to the extent allowed by the proper operation of the meter.

SECTION 8. Parking meters when installed shall be so adjusted as to show legal parking during a period of twelve minutes upon and after the deposit of a United States one cent coin therein and twenty-four minutes upon and after the deposit of two United States one cent coins and sixty minutes upon and after the deposit therein of one United States five cent coin and one hundred twenty minutes upon the deposit therein of two United States five cent coins.

SECTION 9. It shall be unlawful to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug, device or metallic substitute for one cent or five cent coins of the United States.

SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any person to deface, injure, tamper with, open or wilfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed pursuant to this ordinance.

SECTION 11. It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to keep account of all violations of this ordinance.

1. He shall keep an account of and report the number of each parking meter which indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent to such parking meter is or has been parked in violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, the state license number of such vehicle, and any other facts a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation.

2. He shall attach to such vehicle a notice that it has been parked in violation of this ordinance and instructing the owner or operator to report at the office of Chief of Police at the Police Department of Logan City in regard to such violation. Each such owner or operator may, within twenty-four (24) hours after the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay to the said officer in charge at his office, in full satisfaction of such violation, the sum of one dollar (\$1), which shall be remitted by the said clerk to the city treasurer.

SECTION 12. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance and any person who aids, abets or assists therein, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of any amount not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each offense or violation or be imprisoned in the city jail for a term not exceeding one hundred days, or both. A judgment that a fine be paid for a violation of this ordinance shall provide that the person against whom it is directed shall in default of its payment serve one day in the city jail for each \$2.00 of the fine.

SECTION 13. The coins deposited in parking meters as provided herein are hereby levied and assessed as fees to provide for the proper regulation, control and inspection of traffic upon the public streets, and the cost of supervising, regulating and inspection of the parking of vehicles in the parking meter zones created hereby, and to cover the cost of the purchase, supervision, protection, inspection, installation, operation, maintenance, control and use of the parking meters installed therein, and the fund created thereby shall be devoted exclusively to those purposes.

SECTION 14. This ordinance so far as consistent therewith shall be deemed to be in addition and supplementary to, and not in conflict with nore a repeal of prior ordinances of this city,

but shall be an additional provision for the regulation of traffic and parking in the parking meter zones provided for herein.

SECTION 15. The City Commissioners may vary the fee herein required to relieve traffic congestion in designated areas in accordance with this ordinance.

SECTION 16. If any section, part of a section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid the remaining provisions herein shall, nevertheless, remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 17. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance is declared in effect upon publication.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SUBSECTION 2 OF SECTION 11 OF AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TRAFFIC AND REGULATING USE OF PUBLIC STREETS OF AND IN LOGAN CITY AND WHICH WAS PASSED MAY 28th, 1946, BY LOGAN CITY COMMISSION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF LOGAN CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section amended: That sub-section 2 of section 11 of the ordinance relating to traffic and regulating the use of public streets of and in Logan City and passed May 28th, 1946, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

He shall attach to such vehicle a notice that it has been parked in violation of this ordinance and instructing the owner or operator to report at the office of Chief of Police at the Police Department of Logan City in regard to such violation. Each such owner or operator may, within twenty four (24) hours after the time when such notice was attached to such vehicle, pay to the said office at this office, in full satisfaction of such violation, the sum of fifty cents which shall be remitted by the said clerk to the City Treasurer.

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF LOGAN CITY BY ADDING THERETO CERTAIN DESCRIBED LANDS:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF LOGAN CITY, UTAH

Section 1. That the corporate limits of the city of Logan be extended to include and is hereby extended to include the following contiguous described property to the now existing corporate limits of Logan City, State of Utah, that shaded portion shown on that map showing corporate limits of Logan City and annexation as per petition of Logan Chamber of Commerce, dated May 3, 1946, and within the North 1/2 of Section 27, Township 12, North Range 1 East of the Salt Lake Meridian and more particularly described, thus:

Beginning at a point in the present corporate limits of Logan City and in the center line of said Section 27, 2062 feet, more or less, West of the E 1/4 cor. of said Section 27, Township 12 N, Range 1 East of the Salt Lake Base and Meridian: thence North 0° 24' W. 240.1 feet; thence South 89° 1' West 703.4 feet to West line of Fourth East St., extended; thence South 1° 19' East along said street line 227 feet, more or less, to the North Boundary line of the present corporate limits of Logan City 700.00 feet, more or less, west of beginning; thence East along present corporate lines 700.0 feet; more or less, to beginning.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND PROHIBITING THE SALE OF UNCOOKED MEAT OR FISH ON SUNDAY AND LEGAL HOLIDAYS AND HOURS ON OTHER DAYS

SECTION 1. Unlawful to sell meats, etc on Sunday, etc.

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, partnership or corporation to engage in, carry on, or conduct the business of selling or dispensing uncooked or uncured meat, poultry or fish on Sunday or any legal holiday or any other day except between the hours of eight A. M. and Six P. M. provided that on Saturday or the day preceeding any legal holiday, it shall be unlawful to engage in, carry on or conduct said business after 6:30 P. M.

SECTION 2. Penalty. Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof the defendant may be punished in the sum of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$50.00 or by imprisonment in the City Jail of not to exceed thirty (30) days or by both fine and imprisonment.
